RE: Iowa Beef Heifer Award

The Iowa Beef Heifer Award program is being coordinated by the Iowa Cattlemen's Association and sponsored by the Iowa State Fair and Beef Breed Associations. Kent Feeds, Inc. sponsors the show halters for the runners-up. Any 4-H, FFA, or Junior Beef Breed Association member, who will exhibit a beef animal at the Iowa State Fair is eligible to compete for this award.

Objectives

The lowa Beef Heifer Award is a unique contest honoring outstanding youth and future- leaders of the beef industry. In addition, the contest was created to increase interest and participation in the beef breeding heifer project. It encourages a broader outlook of the beef industry through a personal interview with each finalist.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- 1. All applicants must complete the Iowa Beef Heifer Award application and submit it to Mary Greiman, Iowa Cattlemen's Association, 2055 Ironwood Ct, Ames, Iowa 50014, no later than July 1.
- 2. Applicant must exhibit a beef project at the Iowa State Fair in the 4-H, FFA or Open Class Division. This entry must be owned by the applicant.
- 3. Applicants selected as finalists must be present for personal interviews (Monday of the fair) and during the announcement of winners at the Iowa State Fair (Tuesday of the fair). Finalists will be notified of date and time of their interview.
- 4. Past first place winners of the Iowa Beef Heifer Award are <u>not</u> eligible.

SELECTION PROCEDURE:

- 1. Application forms will be available at all County Extension Offices, from Vo-Ag High School Agricultural Instructors and Beef Breed Association Officers.
- 2. Each applicant may participate in one breed division only. Applicants must indicate <u>one</u> of the following breed divisions: Angus, Charolais, Gelbvieh, Hereford, Limousin, Maine Anjou, Red Angus, Salers, Shorthorn or Simmental.
- 3. The Iowa State Fair contributes \$150 for each breed winner on top of the breed Association monies.

Angus -The Iowa State Angus Breeders Association will award a \$500 certificate toward purchase of an Angus heifer at a State Angus Sale.

Charolais - The Iowa Charolais Association will award a \$750 certificate to be validated at the Beef Expo.

Gelbvieh – The Gelbvieh Breeders of Iowa will award a \$500 certificate toward the purchase of a Gelbvieh heifer at the show and sale.

Hereford/Polled Hereford - The Iowa Hereford Breeders Association will give a \$600 certificate to apply to the purchase of a horned or polled Hereford heifer from any IHBA member. If the heifer is purchased at the Iowa Winter Beef Expo sale, an additional \$100 will be awarded; and if the heifer is purchased at the Iowa Winter Beef Expo sale from an Iowa breeder, an additional \$200 will be awarded (maximum \$800 award).

Limousin female at the State Limousin Sale. The applicant must exhibit a Limousin/Lim-Flex heifer or steer at the 2018 Iowa State Fair 4-H, FFA or open Limousin show.

Red Angus - The Iowa Red Angus Association will award a \$500 certificate to apply to the purchase of a Red Angus heifer at the Iowa Winter Beef Expo show and sale.

Salers - The Iowa Salers Association will award a certificate for \$500 toward the purchase of a Salers heifer at the State Salers Sale.

Shorthorn - The Iowa Shorthorn Association will award a \$500 gift certificate to be used at the Iowa Royal Sale toward the purchase of a Shorthorn female.

Simmental - The Iowa Simmental Association will give \$500 to apply to the purchase of a Simmental heifer at the State Sale.

- 4. All applications will be evaluated prior to the Iowa State Fair by a selection committee. Three finalists will be chosen to compete for the heifer cash certificate in each division.
- 5. All finalists must be present for personal interviews with the selection committee at the Iowa State Fair.
- 6. Winners will receive a certificate for the purchase of a registered female. Show halters are presented as second place prizes by Kent Feeds, Inc.

The following criteria will be used for selecting the Beef Heifer Award Finalists:

33 points Size and Scope of Beef Project

- Number of head/type within the breed
- Evidence of growth
- Responsibilities youth assumes

40 points Involvement beyond own operation that directly relates to the Beef Project

- Leadership roles
- Speeches/presentations given
- Exhibits/displays prepared
- Judging teams
- Involvement in Special Beef Events

15 points	Community Involvement

6 points <u>Reference</u>
