Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation Maynard Jayne Student Scholarship Program GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION

Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation's mission is to provide educational and economic opportunities for Iowans in the beef cattle business and enhancing the public perception of the Iowa cattle industry.

Once a qualified applicant's application has been determined complete and eligible for review, it will be considered by the Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee. Emphasis will be placed on an applicant's current financial need.

Applicant Qualifications

- 1. Applicant must be an incoming sophomore, junior, or senior at a 4 year institution. Incoming freshman are not eligible.
- 2. Financial need will be the most important selection criteria.
- 3. Applicants need to have an agricultural emphasis for their major.
- 4. Applicants must be a full time student of an accredited not-for-profit college or university located in the State of Iowa.
- 5. Applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA (accumulative). Student will include a copy of their most recent transcript.
- 6. If selected to receive a Jayne Scholarship, the scholarship applicant will be required to verify their enrollment from their College or University by Jan 30th to the ICA office, before the scholarship check can be issued. Failure to meet enrollment requirements will result in the forfeiture of the scholarship.
- 7. Should the winning applicant fail to complete at least one semester of full time enrollment prior to June 30th, scholarship funds must be returned to the Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation.
- 8. Applicants can only receive a Jayne Scholarship one time.

The winner will be announced at the Iowa Cattlemen's Association's Leadership Summit in December, during the Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation Banquet.

Instructions for Completing Application

Application is an interactive form that contains fields you can select or fill in. The pointer will change to an I-beam where you can type text into the form field. These fields are set to allow a set amount of data and are not dynamic. If your text amount exceeds this limit, it will not be accepted. Check your data to ensure you have not exceeded the limit and revise your answers to meet the space allotted, if necessary. **No additional comments will be accepted.** When you are finished, print the pages, sign and date by hand and return them with the other required documents.

The application may be reproduced on your computer, but the same allotted space must be given to each of the items and questions in the application. **APPLICATION MUST NOT EXCEED FOUR (4) PAGES IN LENGTH.**

Your application MUST include a copy of your most current official college/university transcript. All continuing students will need to send a copy of their most current college/university transcript. The transcript(s) MUST be included with the scholarship application when mailed to the lowa Cattlemen's Foundation. Transcripts sent separate from the scholarship application will not be accepted.

November 15 is the absolute deadline for mailing applications. NOTE: With regard to this deadline, materials mailed must be postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service on or before November 15. Applications, privately metered, will not be accepted. Transcripts are required to be sent with the official scholarship application. We request this in order to help insure that applicants submit a complete and eligible application to the lowa Cattlemen's Foundation.

IMPORTANT FINAL REMINDER: For a scholarship application to be considered *complete and eligible* for review by the Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee, the application MUST:
